

HARPERSFIELD TOWNSHIP

REGULAR SESSION

Held on October 28, 2024

The Board of Harpersfield Township convened in regular session from 7 PM to 7:40 PM in the Administration Building. James Pristov, Chairman, called the meeting to order with the following members and visitors present:

The minutes from the regular session held on September 23, 2024 and October 14, 2024 were reviewed. Ed made a motion to approve the minutes for both regular sessions as written; Mickey seconded; the Board voted unanimously in favor.
The minutes from the bid openings held on August 12, 2024; September 23, 2024 and October 14, 2024 were reviewed. Mickey made a motion to approve the three sets of minutes as written; Jim seconded; the Board voted unanimously in favor.

Larry informed the Board that Chipotle has decided to cancel building the restaurant on Spire Circle. They want to be located on Rt. 534; they are looking for new options but nothing solid on location at this time.

Ed made a motion to pay the following bills: #14339 through #14354; totaling \$137,505.43; Mickey seconded; the Board voted unanimously in favor.
Sharon reported the following receipts: #273-2024 through #285-2024; totaling \$149,267.53.

Mickey questioned the Board on opinion of her writing a letter to County Commissioner Kozlowski to ask if they are planning to support the Township in building pickleball courts. The Board agreed to writing the letter.

Ed commented on the excellent job the road crew did with the parking area with the line stripping including the handicapped spot and installing the curbs.

Ed corrected the custom window purchase for the old town hall building. One non-opening window at a cost of \$1,882.20 and two that open at a cost of \$1,714.88 each. Total quote for the cost for the three windows will be \$5,311.96.

Ed stated that the water lines for South River Road and Bishop Road are both in service and very close to allowing residents to hook into the line.

Jim commented that the clam bake was a success serving 275 dinners with a profit of \$6,600, which is split between the HVFD and Ruritans.
